The 16-19 Bursary is a fund which can be accessed by eligible students who would benefit from financial help. Outlined below, are the areas of school which the bursary fund can aide your child through their studies.

Students may apply for the bursary fund at any point during the academic year. The funding can be accessed both on a short-and long-term basis depending on home and financial circumstances.

LEADING LEARNING TOGETHER

Eligibility

Boston High School aims to ensure that the 16-19 Bursary reaches students who face significant barriers accessing and participating in education. We have a responsibility to ensure that funding is used in ways which help to break down barriers and relieves the costs of education.

There are 3 different funds available to students. They are:

Grade 1

Students will qualify for this bursary if they are/receive:

- Young person in care
- Care Leaver
- Young person in receipt of income support of universal credit
- Disabled young person in receipt of DLA
- Personal Independence Payment (PIP)

The student would need to be 16, 17 or 18 on the 31st August before the academic year to qualify.

Where a student meets any of the above, official confirmation of their qualification for a Grade 1 bursary must be provided. This may be an award document or a letter from the local authority. Only original documents can be accepted.

Upon acceptance, money will be split and paid in instalments via BACS from the finance office.

Grade 2

Grade 2 funding is assessed by formal application. Eligibility for the bursary is based on household income and the number of dependents in the house under the age of 16. For the 24/25 academic year, the threshold of household income is £38,000 or less. This should be evidenced using benefit claims, P60, Tax Credit award notices or evidence of self-employed income. If you are in receipt of Free School Meals, evidence is not required.

Grade 3

This bursary is used on a case-by-case basis. If you have an identifiable financial need and gross annual income is less than **£40,000**, you may be eligible for help towards travel costs. You should apply using the formal application and provide supporting evidence for your financial circumstances.

Grade 3 bursary awards will be re-assessed at the beginning of each term.

Free school meals

If you were in receipt of Free School Meals during year 11, it is likely this will carry over into Sixth Form.

If you do not receive Free School Meals and think you are eligible, please contact Lincolnshire County Council and complete their application form.
