## **Candidate Consent - Information for candidates**

The following information explains what may happen following a Clerical Check or Review of Marking and any subsequent appeal.

If your school requests a Clerical Check or Review of Marking and any subsequent appeal, for one of your examinations after your subject grade has been issued, there are three possible outcomes:

- Your original mark is lowered, so your final grade may be lower than the original grade you received.
- Your original mark is confirmed as correct, so there is no change to your grade.
- Your original mark is raised, so your final grade may be higher than the original grade you received.

In order to proceed a Clerical Check or Review of Marking, you must sign the form overleaf. This tells the Head of your School that you have understood what the outcome might be, and that you give your consent to the Clerical Check or Review of Marking being made.
